#### **Bonfire Reminder**

Just a reminder about bonfires, if you must have fire please be considerate to nearby plot holders. Only burn dry items because this produces much less smoke. If other plot holders are present, always check if smoke is a problem for them. Many of us go to the plots for the pleasure of fresh air and some have health conditions, e.g. Asthma, which means smoke is a hazard. Lastly, please ensure fires are put out fully before you leave the site.

It seems fewer and fewer people are having fires on their allotments, which is much better for the environment. Finding alternate ways of disposing of excess plant material, e.g. having compost bins or taking it to the Tip for composting is a much more eco-friendly solution.



### Foraging Recipes Dandelion Bhajis

#### Ingredients

150g of Gram (chickpea) flour1/4 tsp of chilli powder1/2 tsp turmericSmall green chilli finely chopped40 Dandelion heads, picked from clean site

You can also add in one small finely chopped onion for increased texture if you wish.

#### Cooking

- 1. Mix flour and spices with 100ml of water
- 2. Wash Dandelion heads and pat dry with kitchen towel
- 3. Add chilli and dandelion heads to the mixture
- 4. Deep fry spoonful's in medium heat vegetable oil for 3-4 minutes until golden brown. (Alternatively make the mixture a little thicker and shallow fry in frying pan).
- 5. Drain bhajis off on kitchen towel, salt and serve immediately.
