THE ALLOTMENT SHOP

To run the shop we need 10 volunteers. The shop would be open from February to the end of September (if weather good could stay open until mid-October) from 10.00-12.00 on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

Having discussed at length security, this is not a problem and one of our wooden sheds should be adequate as there will not be valuable stock.

The allotment I spoke to, who have a well-established shop, now make £900 pa. They have given me a copy of their stock keeping paperwork.

We will also need a notepad and small cash box, which is always removed, day's takings should be added up and dated.

Also bagging of products can be done if it is very quiet in the shop into 1.5kg bags. It is a bit of a hub for the community.

Shelving perhaps from Ikea will need to be bought.

Second hand products can be exchanged or sold cheaply.

They use a 15% mark up.

We can also ask our allotment holders what they would like to be sold in the shop.

I have loosely based this list on what they stock in their shop. Delivery is regular and helpful.
